antelope County School Dest #43

The first school to serve the settlers around Royal, Nebraska, was held in a log house one mile north and about one-half mile east of Royal. The teacher was Jonas Houston. The pupils were Will and Ella Bligh, Ed and Jennie Field, Ida, Charles, Will, Ed and John Allen, Will and Ed Dikeman, and the children of Pat Reefe and of Willet Couch.

This log schoolhouse was discarded for a sod house built one mile east and one-half mile north of Royal Nebr. The teachers were Ida Allen Fannon, Albert Wright, Mable Marrow, Lila Garland. Later a frame building took the place of the sod house.
