- UNK parking
 - o SB 2023-02 (parking)
 - o Parking has been and will always be a problem on university campuses.
 - o UNK police had no say in where construction of the new sorority building took place.
 - o University is actively searching for ways to solve parking problems on this campus.
 - O Also actively looking at permit parking to be 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

- This is a problem for residents that pay for parking when others are using those spots during non-ticketing hours during weekdays and on the weekends.
- o Parking signs on campus
 - Looking at replacing faded signs and updating current ones.
- Parking spot shortage
 - There are parking spots on campus for each permit, it just may not be right next to their building.
