- Kristen Hassebrook-NU VP of External Relations
  - o Strategies for student advocacy
    - Distinguishing characteristic is starting with the end in mind.
      - Makes you a lot more capable to adapt to things.
    - Thinking about the different pathways to get to the outcome you want.
    - What are the unique characteristics we as students bring to the table.
      - Things that could either add strength or things we need to check ourselves on.
    - Knowing our audience.

- Who are we going to see, what is their background, what has their experience been like.
- Knowing these things up front can totally change what you bring to a conversation or how you deal with a situation.
- o If you want to be successful in student advocacy, you must really put in the work.
  - It is a long-term commitment process.
- o I love NU week.

  - A lot of engagement activities during that week to participate in.
- George Holman and Kelly Bartling.
  - Advising on campus.
    - Last year got together with faculty and staff on looking at how UNK can improve retention on campus and improve four-year graduation rates.
      - During that conversation talked about one of the areas we could increase that success which meant looking at advising.
    - What can advisors do to help students be successful.
      - Would love a 95-98% retention rate.
      - Sitting at 74% in 2021-22.
        - Would love to see that get up to an 85% rate consistantly.
    - Also want to look toward the future.
      - What does it need to look like five to ten years from now?
      - How can we get the best people in those advising roles for the future.
    - Hoping to wrap up planning grant for advising in August.
      - Hoping this can lead to more grants and more success coaches for UNK.
    - Looking at having students fill out a survey after academic advising meetings.
      - This way the university can get feedback about advising.
