School District No. 111 was organized in 1892 with Miss Nellie Throop, 16 as the first teacher. The school was located across the road from where it stands now. It was moved to its present location in the early 1900's.

Among the improvements was electricity in 1951. The local 4-H club donated and planted an American elm tree in 1952. The porch was enclosed in the 1960's. In 1975 another room was added which served as bathrooms. A telephone was also installed.

Its many graduates include a nun, nurse, a medical student preparing to be a doctor, many teachers, countless homemakers and farmers, along with people in many other vocations.

Today, perhaps some of the great and great, great grandchildren of the first students still attend school here.
